

Sample Election Inspector Script if Limited Term/ Non-Domiciled ID is Presented

Situation: Voter presents Wisconsin Driver's License or Identification Card with "Limited Term" or "Non-Domiciled" printed on it

Election Inspector Question 1: The Department of Motor Vehicles has indicated that your ID is issued to lawful temporary visitors to the United States who are not United States citizens. Do you have with you your naturalization certificate, U.S. passport or other document that shows you are a United State citizen?

- **Voter Produces a naturalization certificate, U.S. passport or other proof of citizenship:** Any of these documents are sufficient to establish U.S. citizenship as well as proof of identification for voting purposes. Voter should be permitted to register and/or vote.
- **Voter does not have any proof of citizenship:** If the voter does not or cannot produce their naturalization certificate, U.S. passport, or any other proof of citizenship, but asserts that they are a U.S. citizen despite lacking that documentation, and the voter wishes to vote or register, the election inspector should begin the challenge process provided on Form EL-104C, Part A. After commencing the challenge process, the election inspector will have to decide whether to withdraw or not withdraw the challenge and then act in accordance with state statute. If the election inspector begins the challenge process, see Question 2 below.

An election inspector cannot refuse to issue a ballot to a voter, or deny them registration, without following the inspector challenge process that is outlined by Wisconsin law.

Election Inspector Question 2: The type of ID that you have presented constitutes cause for me to suspect that you are not a United States citizen. I am therefore challenging your qualifications to register and/or vote. I am now going to bring over another election inspector who will administer that challenge. That challenge process will begin with asking you to make an oath or affirmation. You will then be asked questions which the Commission has determined are appropriate to test your voting qualifications.

Election inspectors should use Form EL-104C to administer and document the challenge.

The election inspector proceeds with the normal inspector challenge process as described by Wis. Stat. § 6.92 and Wis. Admin. Code EL § 9.01. For detailed instructions on how to administer an inspector challenge, see page 71 of the Election Day manual.
